story of <u>Flash</u>, the lost donkey who wandered up Rachel Anne Ridge's driveway just when she needed help negotiating life, faith, and second chances – you'll love <u>Walking with Henry</u>. She and her husband Tom's children are grown and gone, and she is at a new and unexpected point in her spiritual journey: feeling lost, anxious, doubtful. 
