

Lasting Words: A Guide to Finding Meaning Toward the Close of Life

The Ten Gnostic/Essene Commandments of Yeshua from Pistis Sophia

During the Sept. 20th Sunday message, Pastor Rich talked about the Essenes.

The Essenes were an ancient Jewish ascetic sect of the 2nd century BC to the 2nd century AD in Palestine. They lived in highly organized groups and held property in common.

The Essenes are widely regarded as the authors of the Dead Sea Scrolls. Mary, mother of Jesus, and John The Baptist were Essenes.

Yeshua was a common alternative form of the name יהוֹשֵׁעְ in later books of the Hebrew Bible and among Jews of the Second Temple period. The name corresponds to the Greek spelling Iesous, from which, through the Latin Iesus, comes the English spelling Jesus.

Pistis Sophia (Koinē Greek: Πίστις Σοφία) is a Gnostic text discovered in 1773. The expression Pístis Sophía is obscure, and its English translations varied: "The Wisdom of Faith", "Faith Wisdom", "Wisdom in Faith", or "Faith in Wisdom".

I will be gentle and reverent toward all life; I will not kill or benefit from killing.

I will be loving to others and respect their property; I will not hoard or steal.

I will have compassionate and wise relationships; I will not abuse or use others is lust.

I will be forthright, peaceful and honest; I will not deceive.

I will keep the temple of my body and mind righteous and pure; I will not over indulge its desires or endanger its health.

I will cultivate serenity and goodness; I will not gossip or engage in idle negative talk.

I will be humble and helpful to those in need; I will not belittle or live off others.

I will give alms and cultivate gratitude; I will not grumble or give in to envy.

I will be mentally focused and calm; I will not give way to distraction and anger.

I will devote myself to the fourfold God; I will not dishonor their Life, Light, Power or Wisdom.
