# BUCKLAND HISTORICAL SOCIETY COMMUNITY OUTREACH PROJECT: "YOU'VE GOT MAIL" A GREAT SUCCESS, MORE TO COME

The Buckland Historical Society (BHS) hosted a temporary "olde" post office display downstairs at the church during the month of May. BHS interviewed at total of ten individuals familiar with the former post office on Upper Street located next to the Library. Those interviewed shared their memories of life in Buckland Center with post mistresses Eleanor Clark, Rose Mollison, and Betty Purinton, who were all church members, along with remembrances of the post office physical building, it's combination boxes, the bench just inside the door, the neighbors, the Buckland Library, and Dr. Mark Purinton's practice right down the road. Interviews were facilitated by BHS Trustee Mike McCusker and recorded by Ian Hamilton from GCTV who will be editing/slicing together a documentary which will be shown at a future Buckland Historical Society event, and will be eventually available on the society's website: www.bucklandmasshistory.org

The Historical Society is looking at options for a permanent display. One possibility being explored is for a small shed to be placed outside their Museum on Upper Street. An estimate to complete the project could be around \$10,000. The Historical Society will be grateful for any contributions to help make this project happen.

### **Buckland Historical Society - Annual Meeting and Pie Social**

Friday ♦ June 10 ♦ 7pm Buckland Public Hall, 15 Upper Street Buckland's Literary Miscellany with Michael Hoberman Professor of English Literature Fitchburg State University

"It rained just enough last night to settle the dust," Grace Shaw wrote in her diary on July 21, 1888. That the town was dusty in the first place may come as a surprise to those of us who live here in Buckland in an age of paved roads. I am fascinated by this Buckland writer's having described this occurrence as ordinary. I am pleased by her turn-of-phrase.

While only a handful of people in any era actually become "famous writers," everyone who speaks practices a literary style and everyone who writes possesses a poetic imagination. My presentation at the 2022 pie social will use materials from the BHS collection to tell a larger story about how literary fashions and movements of the nineteenth and early twentieth century affected the lives of past generations of Bucklanders.
